

Constitution

ARTICLE I

Name

The name of this organization shall be Asian Cultural Association.

ARTICLE II

Purposes

SECTION 1. To promote cultural understanding of Asian culture.

SECTION 2. To educate the staff, students, and faculty of the Elizabethtown College community about Asian culture by bringing in speakers, creating programs that will make awareness of Asian Culture to the college community, and sponsoring trips to Asian restaurants and places that reflect Asian culture.

SECTION 3. To sponsor campus celebrations of Asian holidays of different Asian backgrounds.

SECTION 4. To promote diversity of Asian Culture to the Elizabethtown College Community.

ARTICLE III

Officers

SECTION 1. The officers of the Asian Cultural Association shall be President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Club Representative.

SECTION 2. All officers shall be elected at a regular Asian Cultural Association meeting between September 1 and September 30 of each year.

SECTION 3. The positions shall be voluntary and there will be a vote for who shall receive the position in office.

SECTION 4. Officers shall be elected by an absolute majority of those present and voting.

SECTION 5. Vacancies occurring among the officers shall be filled voluntary and an election will be held at the first meeting following the occurrence of the vacancy. A person elected to fill a vacancy shall serve as officer until the next annual election.

ARTICLE IV
Executive Board

SECTION 1. The Executive Board shall approve and implement all actions and activities necessary and proper for the functioning of Asian Cultural Association.

SECTION 2. The Executive Board will be governing the group and it's activities.

ARTICLE V
Membership

SECTION 1. Any person in Elizabethtown College meaning the staff, students, or faculty may join and have membership in the group. Any person in Elizabethtown College (staff, students, or faculty) is allowed to join in our meetings for educational purposes.

SECTION 2. There will be no annual fees for the group.

ARTICLE VI
Amendments

This constitution may be amended in the following manner: a member of the group may propose an amendment, in writing, at a regular Asian Cultural Association meeting. Notice that the proposed amendment will be acted upon at the next annual election and shall be given to all members. The proposed amendment shall become effective upon an affirmative vote at the annual election of three-fourths of those voting.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I

Asian Cultural Association Meetings

SECTION 1. Meetings will be held on a bi-weekly-monthly basis. The days of the meetings will be the days that majority of the members voted on.

SECTION 2. The group, as a whole, is not to discriminate any members of different ethnicity, instead to educate cultural differences and invite different ethnicity groups to the group and make them aware of Asian Culture.

ARTICLE II

Duties of the Officers

SECTION 1. The President shall have the supervision of making sure that the group is focused on the Constitution and the by-laws. The President also has the authority to approve the projects that the group wants to do as a whole.

SECTION 2. The Vice-President should gather the information from the group and make a project proposal to the President and also help the President in adjusting or recommending which projects to do or need special attention to.

SECTION 3. The Secretary shall keep the name of the members of the club and to send out messages to the group of the next meeting. The Secretary is responsible for reserving the place and time for the meeting.

SECTION 4. The Treasurer shall keep the official financial records of Asian Cultural Association. The Treasurer shall submit a detailed statement to the advisor of the club.

SECTION 5. The Club Representative shall represent the club in any meeting that Elizabethtown College organizes and also to advertise the program that Asian Cultural Association runs.
