

Elizabethtown Disc Golf Constitution

Article 1:

This club shall be recognized as the Elizabethtown Disc Golf Club

Article 2:

The purpose of this club is to provide organized competition for those individuals who enjoy playing disc golf.

Article 3:

This club shall be open to all students, staff, and faculty of Elizabethtown College. Individuals from outside the college will be allowed to participate on an individual basis.

Article 4:

No dues will be issued unless the budget does not cover some expenses. The budget is to cover travel, tournament fees, and equipment. Course maintenance will also be funded by the budget.

Article 5:

The budget is to cover expenses of a new members first three discs in addition to the expenses listed above. The three discs shall be a putter, mid range, and driver disc.

Article 6:

Officers of the club shall include a President, Vice-President, and Treasurer. These officers will be elected at the end of each spring semester to serve for the following academic year. Elections will be determined by a simple majority of club members.

Article 7:

Competition and tournament schedule will be determined by those schedules of other local disc golf courses. Current members will run the tournament, and participation in not required.

Article 8:

Course maintenance will, when able, be taken care of by members alone. When necessary, Plant Ops will be consulted. If they suggest it, outside contracting may take place to perform tasks we cannot.

Article 9:

While playing disc golf, all club members will adhere to the rules set forth in The Professional Disc Golf Association Rulebook.

Disc Golf Mission Statement

The Disc Golf Club is to provide an active community of Disc Golf enthusiasts to compete against one another. Meetings are held on a need-to-be basis, and any interested member of the Elizabethtown Campus, staff, or community may attend. From time to time tournaments will be held to draw in more public attention as well as to keep the club active. As well as simply playing disc golf, the club is very active in maintaining the Golf Course on our campus. The 105 yd long, Par 54 course was completed in 1999, and has since been improving with constant maintenance.
