Sigma Pi Sigma Constitution

Article I—Name

The name of this organization shall be Sigma Pi Sigma.

Article II—Object

The object of this honor society shall be to

- a. Encourage and assist students interested in physics to develop the knowledge, competence, enthusiasm, and social responsibility that are essential to the advancement of physics
- b. Stimulate interest in advance study and research in physics
- c. Develop collegiality among physics students and faculty members
- d. Promote public interest in physics
- e. Provide liaison between students and member societies of the American Institute of Physics
- f. Recognize high scholarship and potential achievement in physics

Article III—Members

Section 1. Any Elizabethtown College student will be invited to join Sigma Pi Sigma upon fulfillment of the following requirements:

- a. All members must have a declared major or minor in physics or the equivalent
- b. High scholastic achievement in the department
- c. Completed at least three semesters of Physics and Engineering courses
- d. Remain in the upper one third of their class

Article IV—Officers

Section 1. The officers of this club shall be President and Treasurer.

Section 2. The officers shall perform the duties as described in Article VI.

Section 3. The officers shall be elected at the last meeting of the academic year to serve a term of one year and until their successors are elected. Their term of office shall begin upon adjournment of the meeting during which time they are elected.

Section 4. No person shall hold office that is not a member. Members may hold more than one office if membership is low.

Section 5. Duties of the officers

- a. President. The President shall preside over meetings and oversee operations of the club.
- b. Treasurer. The treasurer shall maintain accurate records of all financial concerns of the club.

Article V—Meetings

Section 1. A regular meeting of Sigma Pi Sigma shall occur at the president's discretion.

Section 2. A special meeting shall be held at the decision of the president.

Section 3. Members shall be reminded before each meeting.

Article VI—Amendment

Section 1. This constitution may be amended at any regular or special meeting by a two-thirds vote of members present, provided that notice of the amendment was given to the members in advance.

Section 2. Upon ratification, amendments shall be sent to the Student Senate Judicial Committee and shall be put into effect upon approval of the committee.
